Challenge 1

As you're walking, **be attentive** to your surroundings.

Look out for, and **take photos** of, things which speak to you of the **beauty** and **wonder** of God's creation.

How many are your works, Lord!

There is the sea, vast and spacious, teeming with creatures.

All creatures look to you to give food at the proper time. When you give it to them, they gather it up; when you open your hand, they are satisfied with good things.

As Christians, God gave us a special task: to look after what God has made. We have a responsibility to care for Creation.

We are called to care for the Earth and for one another, including the poorest of the Earth who are most vulnerable to climate change.

We are called to care for the beauty and diversity of species created by our loving God, and for future generations.

Challenge 2

Take some photos of things that you notice that **inspire you** to **take care** of the world around us.

Then God said, "Let us make humankind in our image, according to our likeness; and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the wild animals of the earth, and over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth."

So God created humankind in his image, in the image of God, he created them; male and female he created them.

God blessed them, and God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth and subdue it; and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the air and over every living thing that moves upon the earth." — Genesis 1:26–28
