

Make Up Your Own Route

Pray for:

- Schools: going through a difficult time with exams deferred, etc
- Residential homes, doctor's surgeries, dentists
- Shops and businesses: as they reopen
- Transport: buses, taxi ranks, train stations, etc
- Workers you might see: delivery drivers, refuse collectors, police, road repair crews, heating engineers, postal delivery workers, etc.
- People you know whose homes you pass on your walk: neighbours, church members, etc.

If you have planned a route, you could note below the people and places for whom you will definitely pray. Note them in order and tick them off as you go!

Alternatively, go for a wander and fill in the boxes as you encounter people and places to pray for.

Distance: 1.7 Km (1.0 miles) — Time: 35 to 45 minutes

Prayer walking for Thy Kingdom Come 2021

A Suggested Route

Start at the Haxby and Wigginton Methodist Church

Turn left from the church drive and head towards the Health Centre.

As you pass the Health Centre...

Pray for staff and patients

Continue walking along Mill Lane to Rosedale Nursing Home, which is on the left hand side.

As you pass Rosedale Nursing Home...

Pray for staff, residents and the families of residents

Continue walking along Mill Lane to Wigginton Duck Pond.

Pause by Wigginton Duck Pond

Take a moment to watch the ducks
and reflect on the beauty of God's Creation

Turn left into the side road by the duck pond — Westfield Lane — and walk towards Wigginton Primary School.

Turn left into Greenshaw Drive, with the school now to your right.

As you pass Wigginton Primary School...

Pray for all the staff, pupils and their families

Walk along Greenshaw Drive towards St Nicholas Church, keeping right when Back Lane forks off to the left.

Turn right into the Churchfield snicket (a footpath signposted *Churchfield Open Space*) so the children's playground is on your left.

As you pass the park and dog walking area...

Give thanks for recreation

Continue along the snicket and take the first left into the end of St Nicholas Way, then walk to its end where it joins Greenshaw Drive.

Turn left onto Greenshaw Drive and then right into Westfield Road.

As you walk along Westfield Road...

Pray for the residents of Haxby and Wigginton

At the end of Westfield Road turn left and return to the Haxby and Wigginton Methodist Church.
