Start at the Haxby and Wigginton Methodist Church

Pause at the Porch

Pray for those who have lost their lives in conflicts around the world

Heavenly Father, as we grieve for those who have sacrificed their lives in so many wars, we thank you for the greatest sacrifice of all – your Son Jesus. Help us to live in the power of the resurrection today and every day. Amen

Cross over the road and turn right, heading towards The Village.

Pause at St Mary's Church

Give thanks for their contribution to bringing about peace

At the going down of the sun and in the morning, We will remember them.

Continue walking along The Village.

Cross over the road at the pelican crossing, and turn left towards the roundabout.

Cross over York Road to the Ambulance Station..

Pause at the Ambulance Station

Pray for all NHS workers

Cross back over York Road then right, to the roundabout.

Turn left onto The Village, then left into the Ryedale Court Shopping Centre. Follow its path around, past the shops.

As you pass the Co-operative Funeralcare shop

Pray for the staff, for all undertakers and Crematorium staff.

Pray for all those who have been bereaved.

Continue back along The Village to the Methodist Church.

Cross over the road to the duck pond.

Pause at the Duck Pond

Pray for our community, remembering all who are struggling in this second lock down, and all who are working to provide support.
